TRANSFER GUIDANCE

Transfer Admission Requirements

- Transfer applicants must present a minimum 2.5 cumulative GPA.
- Prior to applying, VCCS applicants must complete an English composition equivalent to ENGH 101 (ENG 112). Students may provide secondary school coursework or test scores demonstrating English language proficiency.
- Prior to applying, VCCS applicants must complete a college-level math course.
- GAA applicants must present a minimum 2.85 cumulative GPA. For more information about Guaranteed Admission Agreement Requirements, visit:

IS THIS DEGREE RIGHT FOR ME?

- Mason's Secondary Education (SEED) program is designed to meet the needs of those at the
 undergraduate level who desire to be licensed to teach at the secondary level, which encompasses
 grades 6-12.
- Specific endorsement areas in this program are biology, chemistry, computer science, Earth science, English, and history/social science
- This is a full-time program that includes multiple clinical experiences and a semester-long
 internship during students' final semester. Working full-time during the day is not an option for
 students in this program. Students who need a more flexible scheduling option should pursue the
 Bachelor's to Accelerated Master's (BAM) for Secondary Education (SEED).
- Prior to completing the internship, students must pass a state licensure exam.

WHAT IS THE IMPACT ON MY DEGREE OF WORK I HAVE ALREADY COMPLETED?

 Associate Transfer Degree Completion: Students who complete a VCCS transfer associate degree (AS, AA, AA&S, & AFA) will receive a waiver of the Foundation and Exploration (lower division) Mason Core general education categories. To be eligible for the waiver, the students must provide the Mason Office of Admissions with a final, official transcript reflecting the degree conferral date. As a prerequisite for ENGH 302, ENGH 101 is not waived. Students must complete ENGH 100 or ENGH 101, or an equivalent, with a C or higher.

- Dual Enrollment Completion of Associate Degree in HS: Applicants are required to apply as freshman.
- Credit for Prior Learning: Credit by exam may be used to fulfill General Education and/or major requirements. See:

- Students must earn a C or better in all SEED Core Courses and pass all Content Area Courses.
- Students must maintain an overall 2.5 GPA and pass all Commonwealth of Virginia mandated tests for licensure
- Licensure testing requirements are determined by the Commonwealth of Virginia and may change
 at any time. If changes to these requirements occur, students must meet the current testing and
 licensure requirements as set forth in the legal code of Virginia.
- Students are encouraged to meet with the Mason program advisor prior to enrolling in courses at Mason.
