TRANSFER GUIDANCE

Guaranteed Admission Agreement between NSU and the VCCS

By meeting the following criteria, you are guaranteed admittance into Norfolk State University. This agreement does not guarantee your enrollment in any specific major.

- Earn a transfer associate degree (AA, AS, or AA&S) with a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher.
- Complete all courses in the pathway, earning a grade of C or higher on all courses.
- A minimum of 30 credits must be completed at the 2-year college awarding the associate degree.
- A maximum of 63 credits will transfer and apply toward a bachelor's degree requirements.
- Submit (register) your intent by the end of your first semester using the portal.
- Submit your transfer application for admission by May 1, including an unofficial transcript.
- Request an official transcript to be sent upon completing the associate degree.
- Transfer within four years of first enrolling at the community college and within one year of completing an appropriate associate degree.
- Dual enrollment students, see bullet below for clarification on eligibility.

WHAT SHOULD I CONSIDER WHEN SELECTING COURSES?

WHICH MAJORS WILL BE AVAILABLE TO ME THROUGH THIS GAA?

Acceptance in some degree programs at NSU is competitive; thus, guaranteed admission into NSU does not imply admission to these programs without further acceptance by the program or department offering the program.

- Students participating in the GAA should follow all special college and/or departmental application procedures and deadlines when applying to the following programs:
 - a. B.S. Nursing (Traditional & RN to BSN Online)
 - b. B.S. Exercise Science (Kinesiotherapy)
 - c. B.S. Health Services Management
 - d. Bachelor's Degree in Social Work (BSW)
- e. All degree programs with teacher certification endorsement programs in the Department of Early Childhood/Elementary & Special Education, Health & Physical Education, and Secondary Education & School Leadership.
- GAA students will be given the same consideration as all other students for admission to competitive programs, as well as for registration, financial aid, student housing, and any other opportunities open to other students.
- GAA students must follow all NSU application processes and specific special departmental/program application procedures, deadlines, and grade point average requirements.

WHAT IS THE IMPACT ON MY DEGREE OF WORK I HAVE ALREADY COMPLETED?

- Associate Transfer Degree Completion: Completion of a transfer-level associate degree satisfies all lower-division general education requirements.
- Dual Enrollment Completion of Associate Degree in HS: The agreement of guaranteed admission into the college applies to students earning an associate degree concurrent with high school who have completed a transfer-approved degree with a minimum of 45 credits completed through a Virginia Community College, with a GPA of 2.0 or higher and that meets all requirements outlined in the Transfer Guide.
- Credit for Prior Learning: All course credits that were awarded by the two-year institution for equivalent prior learning experiences (IB, AP, CLEP, Military, etc.) will transfer based on the transfer equivalence for the course awarded.
- Catalog Year: Catalog year determined by first semester of attendance at the community college post high school graduation. For students maintaining continuous enrollment, this entitlement will be in effect for a minimum of four years from the time of the student's first enrollment at the two-year institution. Students must enroll at the four-year institution within one year of completing their associate degree.

WHAT ARE MY CHANCES FOR GETTING ACCEPTED?

- If you apply through general application instead of through the GAA, you will be considered for admission with all other transfer applicants.
- NSU accepts close to 90 percent of students who complete an application.
- The average GPA of students admitted is a 2.9.
