Guaranteed Admission Agreement

By meeting the following criteria, students who complete the prescribed curriculum and meet the criteria below are guaranteed admission into Radford University and directly into the BA in Theatre.

- Earn a transfer associate degree
- Earn a minimum of 2.8 GPA for the associate degree
- Good academic standing at current institution

WHAT SHOULD I CONSIDER WHEN SELECTING COURSES?

- Consider using VCCS Free Electives to fulfill Radford College of Visual Arts (CVPA) and any
 other BA degree requirements outside of the Theatre major

IS THIS DEGREE RIGHT FOR ME?

- This degree is right for you if you want to study entertainment production and design (including scenic, costume, lighting, sound and technical production)
- This degree is right for you if you want to explore directing and stage management
- This degree is right for you if you want to work in a variety of professions in the entertainment industry
- This degree is right for you if you want to teach drama/theatre in secondary/elementary schools (with additional coursework)
- This degree is right for you if you want to pursue graduate studies in Theatre or Drama

WHAT IS THE IMPACT ON MY DEGREE OF WORK I HAVE ALREADY COMPLETED?

- Associate Transfer Degree Completion: The completion of the transfer-oriented degree
 program will satisfy the REAL Curriculum (lower division/general education) requirements.
 Students will need to complete all other University, college, and departmental requirements
 in order to obtain the baccalaureate degree from RU.
- Dual Enrollment Completion of Associate Degree in HS: Students completing the associate
 degree in high school should apply using the freshman application. If admitted, the student
 will receive the benefits associated with the transferable associate degree (as noted prior).

- Credit for Prior Learning: AP, IB, and CLEP are evaluated for credits (based on receipt and evaluation of official scores).
- Catalog Year: Students will be subject to the catalog in effect at the time of enrollment at RU
 unless otherwise requested.

OTHER THAN CLASSES, ARE THERE OTHER PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS?

• Prospective students must complete an Entry Interview/Audition

- Students must be involved in a production experience (onstage or backstage) for each semester they attend RU
- Students must attend monthly departmental meetings
- Students participate in progress reviews (annually for performers, semiannually for design/tech)
- Students must attain a 2.5 minimum GPA in the major to graduate in Theatre
