TRANSFER GUIDANCE

Guaranteed Admission Agreement

By meeting the following criteria, students who complete the prescribed curriculum and meet the criteria below are guaranteed admission into Radford University and directly into Social Work.

- Earn a transfer associate degree based on the Social Work Curriculum
- Earn a minimum of 2.8 GPA for the associate degree
- Good academic standing at current institution

WHAT SHOULD I CONSIDER WHEN SELECTING COURSES?

- Connect with an advisor at your community college and an admissions counselor at RU within your first year.

IS THIS DEGREE RIGHT FOR ME?

- A Bachelor of Social Work (B.S.W.) offers a professional degree for a variety of in-demand career options that include case manager, child welfare specialist, family service worker, mental health aide, substance abuse worker, and rehabilitation specialist.
- Full-time and part-time plans are available.
- Small classes and faculty advising.
- Variety of field internship sites available.

WHAT IS THE IMPACT ON MY DEGREE OF WORK I HAVE ALREADY COMPLETED?

- **Associate Transfer Degree Completion:** The completion of the transfer-oriented degree program will satisfy the REAL Curriculum (lower division/general education) requirements. Students will need to complete all other University, college, and departmental requirements in order to obtain the baccalaureate degree from RU.
- **Dual Enrollment – Completion of Associate Degree in HS:** Students completing the associate degree in high school should apply using the freshman application. If admitted, the student will receive the benefits associated with the transferable associate degree (as noted prior).

WHAT ARE MY CHANCES FOR GETTING ACCEPTED?

- Of students who apply, about 65% of transfer applicants are accepted to Radford University and about 80% of the entering transfer class comes from Virginia community colleges.

OTHER THAN CLASSES, ARE THERE OTHER PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS?

- Complete the Plan of Study with a minimum cumulative 2.0 GPA. All program-specific and minor courses require a minimum letter grade of “C” or higher.
- As a minimum, 120 semester hours are required for graduation.
