Radford University and VCCS Guaranteed Admission Agreement

By meeting the following criteria, students who complete the prescribed curriculum and meet the criteria below are guaranteed admission into Radford University.

- Earn a transferable associate degree.
- Earn a minimum of 2.8 cumulative GPA.
- Good academic standing at current institution.

WHAT IS THE IMPACT ON MY DEGREE OF WORK I HAVE ALREADY COMPLETED?

- **Associate Transfer Degree Completion:** Completion of the transfer-oriented degree program will satisfy the REAL Curriculum (lower division/general education) requirements.
- **Dual Enrollment – Completion of Associate Degree in HS:** Students completing the associate degree in high school should apply using the freshman application. If admitted, the student will receive the benefits associated with the transferable associate degree (as noted above).
- **Credit for Prior Learning:** Specific course credit will only be added to a student record once official scores are received and evaluated by the Office of Admissions. An official Joint Services Transcript should be sent for evaluation of specific military credit.
- **Catalog Year:** Students will be subject to the catalog in effect at the time of enrollment at RU unless otherwise requested.
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IS THIS COLLEGE RIGHT FOR ME?

- Located in the city of Radford, RU is a mid-sized institution where students find small class sizes, great advising, and students are priority.
 - Transfer students have the option of choosing to live on-campus or off-campus within the local area.
 - RU is situated close to the Blue Ridge Mountains and on the banks of the New River, allowing the opportunity for students to explore the outdoors.
 - Over 80% of students receive some form of financial aid.

- This program prepares individuals to work and serve children and youth who are deaf and hard of hearing in all educational settings.
- As part of the program, you'll meet children from preschool through secondary age who are Deaf or Hard of Hearing and experience a variety of educational placements such as inclusive classrooms, self-contained classrooms and a residential school for the Deaf.

WHAT ARE MY CHANCES FOR GETTING ACCEPTED?

- Of students who apply, usually about 65% of transfer applications are accepted to Radford University and about 80% of the entering transfer class comes from the Virginia Community College System.

- After completing the IDHH degree and licensure program, you can apply to the 4+1 Master of Science Degree in Special Education: General Curriculum and earn an additional endorsement in Special Education: General Curriculum, K-12, in just one more year of study!

OTHER THAN CLASSES, ARE THERE OTHER PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS?

- Passing scores on prescribed licensure assessments required for admission to the Teacher Education Program and field experience.
- Passing scores on Praxis: Teaching Reading, Elementary prior to degree completion and licensure application.
- Support provided for preparation for licensure assessments.
- Vouchers to cover the costs of assessments available.
- Maintain a minimum 2.5 GPA to enter the Teacher Education Program and begin field experience.
