Guaranteed Admission Agreement

By meeting the following criteria, students who complete the prescribed curriculum and meet the criteria are guaranteed admission into Radford University.

- Earn a transfer associate degree
- Earn a minimum of 2.8 GPA for the associate degree
- Good academic standing at current institution

IS THIS DEGREE RIGHT FOR ME?

- Journalism is a concentration in the Media Studies major. The Media Studies major is designed for students with an interest in media or other related mass communication fields.
- The Journalism concentration prepares students for a rapidly changing field, from traditional newspaper careers to multimedia, and websites. There is always demand for the skills involved in gathering, reporting, and interpreting nonfiction and public affairs information.

WHAT IS THE IMPACT ON MY DEGREE OF WORK I HAVE ALREADY COMPLETED?

- **Associate Transfer Degree Completion:** The completion of the transfer-oriented degree program will satisfy the REAL Curriculum (lower division/general education) requirements. Students will need to complete all other University, college, and departmental requirements in order to obtain the baccalaureate degree from RU.
- **Dual Enrollment – Completion of Associate Degree in HS:** Students completing the associate degree in high school should apply using the freshman application. If admitted, the student will receive the benefits associated with the transferable associate degree (as noted prior).
- **Credit for Prior Learning:** AP, IB, and CLEP are evaluated for credits (based on receipt and evaluation of official scores).

- **Catalog Year:** Students will be subject to the catalog in effect at the time of enrollment at RU unless otherwise requested.
