TRANSFER GUIDANCE

By meeting the following criteria, you are eligible for admission to the Bachelor of Liberal Studies (BLS) degree program at the University of Mary Washington. Separate admission to the Criminal Justice major is not required.

- Meet <u>eligibility requirements</u> for the Bachelor of Liberal Studies degree program.
 Traditional transfer students not meeting these eligibility requirements may not pursue
 Criminal Justice at the University of Mary Washington.
- Earn at least 30 transferable credits (grades of "C" or higher are required for transfer credits). Courses must be from the 100-level or higher. The five required ADJ courses (or approved substitutions) may be completed at any time pre- or post-matriculation.
- Completion of an Associate degree is not required for admission to BLS. Full admission requirements can be found here: https://catalog.umw.edu/undergraduate/admission-enrollment/admission-bachelor-liberal-studies-bls-program/
- Apply to the Bachelor of Liberal Studies degree program by selecting "Adult Degree Completion" as your program of interest on the transfer application.
- Request official transcripts to be sent from all prior institutions to <u>admit@umw.edu</u>, including score reports and transcripts from alternative credit, if applicable, such as <u>AP, IB</u>, CLEP, or ACE.

WHAT SHOULD I CONSIDER WHEN SELECTING COURSES?

- Create a schedule for all required courses, pay attention to prerequisites and when courses are
 offered, complete your first math and English courses in your first year. For help, see Transfer

- Proficiency in a second language is waived for BLS students.
- Connect with an advisor at your community college and University of Mary Washington within your first year. College Connect is available in your account at www.TransferVirginia.org.

IS THIS DEGREE RIGHT FOR ME?

- The UMW major in Criminal Justice is only open to students earning a Bachelor of Liberal Studies (BLS) degree. The major includes core courses in Administration of Justice (ADJ), Psychology (PSYC), and Sociology (SOGC) and also features a capstone internship experience to provide hands-on training.
- The Criminal Justice major requires 45 credits overall. The major includes 15 transfer credits in Administration of Justice (ADJ) from the Virginia Community College System. These credits can be completed at any time pre- or post-matriculation.
- Students in this special major must earn a minimum of 30 credits at UMW to complete all requirements and a total of 120 overall credits to earn a BLS degree.

WHAT IS THE IMPACT ON MY DEGREE OF WORK I HAVE ALREADY COMPLETED?

- Associate Transfer Degree Completion: Transfer students with a VCCS Associate degree have completed many of the UMW general education requirements. UMW does not allow students to satisfy the Digital Intensive and Diverse & Global Perspectives general education requirements through transfer coursework.
- Dual Enrollment Completion of Associate Degree in HS: Students participating in dual
 enrollment programs are considered as freshman applicants and are not eligible for BLS unless
 other college-level coursework has been completed and eligibility requirements are met. Dual
 enrollment courses taken at the high school are treated identically with the same course when
 taken on a college campus; dual enrollment status does not affect the transferability of the
 course.
- Credit for Prior Learning: UMW accepts credit for AP, IB CLEP, Cambridge, and other qualifying credit. Additionally, BLS accepts this credit both pre- and post-matriculation. - Catalog Year: Students must complete general education requirements associated with the academic year in which they enroll at UMW. Students complete major requirements associated with the academic year in which they declare their major.

DO MORE WITH YOUR DEGREE!

Most students pursue an internship at some point during their time at UMW. The University
and Bachelor of Liberal Studies office support students in their search through networking,
individual consultations, and campus resources.

OTHER THAN CLASSES, ARE THERE OTHER PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS?

- Students must earn at least 30 residential credits at UMW as a degree-seeking student (not including Physical Education credits).
- Up to 6 credits in Physical Education may be counted toward the BLS degree.
- Students must earn a cumulative GPA of 2.0 in both their major and their overall coursework in order to complete their degree.
