CREDITS PRE-TRANSFER: 60-63
Students may transfer up to 60 credits to UVA.

CREDITS POST-TRANSFER: 60
Students must take a minimum of 60 credits post-transfer to meet the 120-credit requirement for graduation.

TRANSFER GUIDANCE

Competitive applicants for UVA's School of Education and Human Development:

- Meet all lower-division general education requirements.
- Earn a minimum GPA of 3.0 or better at your current institution.
- Have 54-60 transferable credits.
- Have prior experience working with youth; experience can be within or outside of schools.

This transfer guide shows an optimal path to a bachelor's degree in biology education at the University of Virginia. Completing the coursework above will position you to transfer to UVA with junior (third year) standing and a pathway to graduate in two years. WHAT SHOULD I CONSIDER WHEN SELECTING COURSES?

- Connect with an advisor at your community college and UVA's School of Education and Human Development within your first year.

IS THIS DEGREE RIGHT FOR ME?

- Are you passionate about learning? Do you want to be an educator?
- Do you enjoy collaborating for the success of others?
- This program leads to a Bachelor of Science in Education degree and a Virginia teaching license.

WHAT IS THE IMPACT ON MY DEGREE OF WORK I HAVE ALREADY COMPLETED?

- **Associate Transfer Degree Completion:** Transfer up to 60 credits to the University. Satisfy all lower-division general education requirements. Graduate within 4 semesters after transferring.
- **Dual Enrollment – Completion of Associate Degree in HS:** Students who complete the associate degree concurrently with high school will apply to UVA as first-year students. During the first year, students can apply to transfer to the Teacher Education program for their second year. Students can transfer up to 60 credits to the University. Students will need to complete a minimum of three years at UVA to enroll in and finish the Teacher Education program.
- **Credit for Prior Learning:** AP and IB scores are evaluated for credit.

- **Catalog Year:** Catalog year determined by first semester of attendance at the community college post-high school graduation.

IS THIS COLLEGE RIGHT FOR ME?

- This is a full-time residential program located in Charlottesville, VA. Students must be available for classes and field experiences during the day, and some evening classes are required.
- UVA's School of Education and Human Development provides the feeling of a smaller school while offering the benefits of being part of a large university.
- Teacher Education faculty and students are deeply committed to working together with our school partners to create a more just society.

- Completing your Associate transfer degree post-high school satisfies all lower division general education requirements and increases the chance of completing your bachelor's degree?
- Exceeding 3 years or 90 credits at your community college means you may have exhausted your financial aid at that college and have limited your future financial aid at UVA?

WHAT CAN I DO WITH THIS DEGREE?

Most Teacher Education graduates go on to teach. Graduates also pursue careers in non-traditional education settings, non-profit organizations, and local and state educational agencies.

PROGRAM SUCCESSES & HIGHLIGHTS

- More than 95% of program graduates applying to teaching positions are hired.
- Many UVA Teacher Education graduates go on to be teacher leaders in the field.

WHAT ARE MY CHANCES FOR GETTING ACCEPTED?

- UVA tends to admit 35-40% of transfer applicants who apply to start at UVA in the fall.
- The Teacher Education program is committed to accepting as many qualified applicants as they are able to support with high-quality advising and field placements.

DO MORE WITH YOUR DEGREE!

- EHD offers a guaranteed admission pathway for Teacher Education students to enter many of the school's graduate programs within five years of completing the bachelor's degree. Approximately 1/3 of students who complete UVA's undergraduate Teacher Education program pursue a graduate degree at UVA's School of Education and Human Development.

OTHER THAN CLASSES, ARE THERE OTHER PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS?

- Students will complete a minimum of four clinical experiences in schools in the Charlottesville region. These experiences include two 4-hour/week practicum courses (3rd year fall and spring), a 16-hour/week internship (4th year fall), and full-time student teaching (4th year spring).

- Students must complete required exams and trainings to meet state licensing requirements.
